Immense challenge for "Chase" racers this weekend at the Monster Mile

DOVER, Del. – With one race down in the "Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup," all eyes are now on the Monster Mile, a track that is historically known to be one of the toughest challenges in the 10-race Chase. Just ask defending "Chase" champion Jimmie Johnson.

"It's a race where you have to be on your toes from the start of practice on Friday all the way through the event," said the two-time NASCAR Sprint Cup champion and driver of the No. 48 Lowe's Chevrolet, at a press conference last week at New Hampshire. "It's a pretty intense track."

No driver has ever won a Dover September Chase race and gone on to win the championship, and the last time a driver won the September Dover race and the championship in the same season was Jeff Gordon in 1995.

The 12 Chase drivers have a combined total of 15 wins at Dover International Speedway (Gordon 4, Johnson 3, Stewart 2, Edwards 1, Biffle 1, Earnhardt Jr. 1, Burton 1, Ky. Busch 1 and Kenseth 1). Of the top-12 drivers, Denny Hamlin, Clint Bowyer and Kevin Harvick have never won a NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race at Dover. Hamlin and Bowyer, however, have recently won in the NASCAR Nationwide Series at Dover (Hamlin Sept. 2007 & June 2008, Bowyer Sept. 2006).

Dover has hosted four races since the inception of the Chase, each with its own memorable outcome, that have established the track as one of the biggest challenges in the 10-race Chase. In Dover's first Chase event on Sept. 26, 2004, Ryan Newman built an eight second lead over the final 130 laps to win for the third time at the Monster Mile, the one and only time a driver has ever been able to dominate a Chase race at Dover.

The following year, on Sept. 25, 2005, after 400 grueling miles, the field needed a green-white-checked finish to determine the outcome of this race. In the end, Jimmie Johnson scored the victory by a slim .080-second margin over Kyle Busch as he also took the lead in the Chase standings.

In the Sept. 24, 2006 event, a thrilling 20-lap duel between 2003 champion Matt Kenseth and a determined Jeff Burton kept fans on their feet as Burton would make a late-race pass to secure his first NASCAR Sprint Cup Series win in more than five years as Kenseth's gas tank ran dry.

Last year, on Sept. 23, 2007, Carl Edwards, always a threat to win on concrete race tracks, pulled off his first Dover NASCAR Sprint Cup Series win by getting several good jumps on late-race restarts to edge Greg Biffle to the checkered flag.

Goodyear test session confirms tire choice for upcoming Dover race weekend

The Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company tested at Dover International Speedway this past Wednesday and confirmed a new right-side tire for when the NASCAR Sprint Cup and NASCAR Nationwide Series cars race at the Monster Mile on September 19-21. Participating in the test at Dover were Bobby Labonte in the #43 Petty Enterprises Dodge and Mark Martin in the #8 Dale Earnhardt Inc. Chevy.

"We made three long runs on each car during the heat of the afternoon, and were very happy with the results," said Greg Stucker, Goodyear's director of race tire sales. "Our goal was to provide a slight increase in grip without negatively impacting tire temperatures or wear, and we feel like we accomplished just that."

The new right-side code (D-4186) will be paired with the same left-side code (D-4134) that was successfully raced at Dover earlier this spring.

Goodyear is in the midst of a busy testing schedule, starting with last week's visit to Kansas Speedway and this week's stop at Dover International Speedway.

Likewise, Ricky Carmichael has shown to be lightning fast from the get-go. Considered to be the greatest AMA motocross racer of all-time, Carmichael has gone from two wheels to four, and will race the full East Series schedule with Ken Schrader Racing.

Series veterans Steve Park, Matt Kobyluck and second-year East Series sensations Jeffrey Earnhardt and Peyton Sellers will no doubt give the young guns a run for their money, and will be in hot pursuit of the "Sunoco 150" monster trophy.

History of the “Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup” at Dover International Speedway

DOVER, Del. – The Chase format was implemented in 2004 to involve more drivers in the championship hunt, and intensify fan interest and drama during the season’s stretch run. Three years later, prior to the 2007 season, NASCAR announced adjustments to the Chase format designed to establish more of a balance between winning and consistency, while expanding the field to include 12 drivers.

Dover has hosted four races that have each played a huge role in determining the final season’s standings, each with its own memorable outcome, that have established the track as one of the biggest challenges in the 10-race Chase.

Sept. 26, 2004: Ryan Newman wins Dover’s first Chase race

Dover’s September race weekend becomes best known as race No. 2 in the “Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup” with the announcement of the Chase format introduced by NASCAR prior to the 2004 season. Chase competitor Jeremy Mayfield kicked off the weekend by scoring the pole position for the race, setting the track qualifying record with a lap of 161.522 mph, but fellow Chaser Ryan Newman got off to a fast start from the second starting position to dominate early on. Newman would build an eight second lead over the final 130 laps to win for the third time in four races at Dover. Eventual 2004 champion Kurt Busch finished fifth.

Sept. 25, 2005: Jimmie Johnson wins by .080 seconds over Kyle Busch

Sept. 2004 race winner Ryan Newman won the first race in the Chase at New Hampshire and carried that momentum into Dover as he would start from the pole position. But after 400 grueling miles, the field needed a green-white-checkered finish to determine the outcome of this race. In the end, Jimmie Johnson scored the victory by a slim .080-second margin and also took the lead in the Chase; a Chase that was won by Tony Stewart who would rebound from a 18th place finish at Dover to win the 2005 crown by 35 points over Greg Biffle.

Sept. 24, 2006: Jeff Burton snaps his 175-race winless streak

Consistent top-10 finishes throughout the first 26 races carried Jeff Burton into the top-10 in the point standings, ultimately giving Burton a shot at the championship title. Burton would work his way through the field from a 19th starting position, and after a thrilling 20-lap duel with 2003 champion Matt Kenseth, he would hold on to score his first NASCAR Sprint Cup Series win in more than five

years. Jimmie Johnson, who finished 13th in this race, would string together several top-five finishes over the final eight races to win his first series championship.

Sept. 23, 2007: Carl Edwards survives late-race carnage to win

Carl Edwards, always a threat to win on concrete race tracks, pulled off his first Dover Cup win by getting several good jumps on late-race restarts to edge Greg Biffle to the checkered flag. The win helped Edwards move from eighth to third in the point standings. Jimmie Johnson, who finished 14th in this event, would later win four races in a row late in the season and easily win his second consecutive series crown.

How the Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup field is determined

The first 26 points events of the 36-race season determine the drivers eligible for the Chase for the NASCAR Sprint Cup and ultimately, the series title. After race No. 26 at Richmond, the top-12 drivers qualify for the Chase. Chase drivers' point totals will be adjusted prior to the season's final 10 races. The adjusted totals distinguish the Chase field in the final season standings. All drivers will begin with 5,000 points; each then will receive a 10-point bonus for each victory during the first 26 events. Chase drivers will be "seeded" to start the Chase based on the number of wins amassed in the first 26 events.

Chase participants compete with all other drivers during the final 10 races. Each week, all 43 drivers battle for victories and prize money and continue their season under the standard point system.

Neat Dover Chase race notes

- No driver has won a Dover September Chase race and gone on to win the championship.
- The last time a driver won the September Dover race and the championship in the same season was Jeff Gordon in 1995.
- In four Chase races at Dover, the highest an eventual season champion has finished was fifth (Kurt Busch, 2004).

Sunday, July 6, 2008 will mark 40 years since Dover's first NASCAR race

DOVER, Del. - Sunday, July 6, 2008 will mark 40 years since Dover International Speedway first opened its gates for the inaugural "Mason-Dixon 300." The track has since hosted 77 NASCAR Sprint Cup Series races and has become a fixture on the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series circuit, but the story of the Monster Mile's first race is truly a remarkable one.

By mid-1967, a concept became a reality when plans for a multi-use racing complex were put into action. Giant earth-moving machines worked on more than 200 acres north of highway U.S. 13 in Dover to create a 5/8-mile harness track inside a larger one-mile, high-banked oval race track.

Over 200 construction workers tackled the 'monster' project which lasted nearly two years. The asphalt was laid in the Spring of 1969, and by late-June, the track was ready for racing. The drivers however had little time to learn about the new track. They rushed from Daytona to Dover just two days after the "Firecracker 400," traditionally held on the July 4 holiday, to make the Sunday race.

"The first time we ran at Dover we didn't know anything about it," said eventual winner, Richard Petty. "We had run on July 4th in Daytona and we came right to Dover. We practiced maybe eight to 10 laps, then qualified and ran 300 miles."

With just over 10,000 fans in attendance, 32 drivers in NASCAR's premier series lined up for the inaugural "Mason-Dixon 300." David Pearson's No. 17 Ford scored the pole with a lap of 130.430 mph, setting the first track record. At the time, Pearson's qualifying speed was the fastest ever run by a NASCAR Sprint Cup Series car on a one-mile speedway.

Dedication ceremony fit for "The King": Richard Petty to be honored with a marquee plaque on the Monster Monument on Sept. 20, 2008

DOVER, Del. – On July 6, 1969, Richard Petty took the first checkered flag at a new, high-banked racetrack in Dover, Del. Piloting his No. 43 Ford, Petty started the race in the third position and went on to lead 150 of 300 laps en route to a dominating win in the inaugural Mason-Dixon 300.

40 years, and seven Dover International Speedway wins later, Petty will be honored with a marquee plaque on the Monster Monument at Victory Plaza, presented by AAA, on Saturday, Sept. 20, 2008 at Dover International Speedway. The 46-foot monument was unveiled in May 2008 and created a new focal point for race fans visiting the concrete, one-mile oval.

Petty joins Bobby Allison as the only drivers honored with a marquee plaque on the monument, located outside of Turn 4 at the Speedway. The special four-foot high granite plaque will be mounted on the monument's base and will include Petty's career and Dover highlights and an engraved image of the driver, in a section reserved for retired drivers who've established their legacy at the Monster Mile.

A dedication ceremony for Petty is scheduled to begin at 1p.m. near the monument, and fans are invited to watch a special question-and-answer session hosted by NASCAR on Fox's Mike Joy and Dover President & CEO Denis McGlynn. *Update: Due to a conflict, NASCAR on ESPN host Allen Bestwick will emcee the event.* The ceremony is part of several attractions planned to celebrate Dover's 40th anniversary season during the Sept. 19-21, 2008 race weekend. Free fan additions include strolling entertainment, live music, the Aqua String Mummers band, free autograph sessions and more.

The undisputed king of stock-car racing, with 200 career NASCAR Sprint Cup Series wins, notched his 199th win of his career at Dover on May 20, 1984. This achievement set him up for career win No. 200 at Daytona just weeks later.

Petty won seven NASCAR Sprint Cup Series championships during his 35-year career spanning from 1958 to 1992 and ranks first in a variety of NASCAR records including: all-time wins (200), races started (1,184), top-five finishes (555), top-10 finishes (712), pole positions (126), laps completed (307,836), laps led (52,194), races led (599) and consecutive races won (10).

On Sept. 20 at Dover, Petty will have his legacy enshrined on the Monster Monument at Victory Plaza, presented by AAA – another supreme accomplishment by a member of NASCAR royalty.
